A friend just sent you the link to an article that deals with healthy school lunches which were introduced after a public campaign by TV chef Jamie Oliver. However, now they are in danger as the government no longer wants to pay for them. You decide to write **a letter to the editor** of **250 words** in which you offer your opinion.

Jamie Oliver's school lunch programme is in jeopardy

Five years ago the great one went on a public rampage about the terrible quality of the lunches served to children in schools. Due to his zealous campaign, the hated deep-fried "turkey twizzlers" were replaced by healthy food in schools across the country. That is set to change now, as school budgets are reduced. Oliver is incensed and said that he hopes the government will continue to invest in "quality school food, and the integral support and training of kitchen staff". He writes: "I believe that any compromise on a child's right to a healthy school lunch... is child abuse on an unimaginable scale." The government has already scrapped the proposed extension to free school meals, and earlier this year the Minister of Health criticised the 'Jamie Oliver' approach to school dinners. He believes parents should take over the responsibility.

- Rescue services increasingly rely on social networks for real-time information during emergencies.
 Any restrictions could cost lives.
- Nobody supports blanket censorship for books, films or the press any more. Social media are no different in principle from other media.

"Popularity vs. eating disorders"

After having read the following information about a newly developing eating disorder among teenagers called "wannarexia" in class, you decide to write an article of about 250 words for the school magazine in which you discuss several different forms of eating disorders and their possible causes. Also find an appropriate title.

Your article should include

- a definition of "wannarexia"
- at least two different forms of eating disorders and their symptoms
- reasons why mostly young adults develop eating disorders, referring to
- the media
- societal expectations
- peers

Some teenagers think "If they become thin, or get an eating disorder, they will be popular," said Kreipe, the medical director at the Western New York Comprehensive Care Center for Eating Disorders in Rochester.

While Kreipe had seen this phenomenon before, only recently has it acquired a name: wannarexia.

Most commonly found among teenage girls, wannarexia is a label describing those who claim to have anorexia, or wish they did. While wannarexia hasn't been studied, experts say a growing number of girls have a misguided desire to be anorexic to gain popularity or to lose weight. [...]

"Kids simply do what other kids do," said Dr. Tom Kersting, a New Jersey-based psychotherapist, school counselor and author of *Losing Weight When Diets Fail*. "They strive to be popular ... find me a popular girl who's not thin. You won't find many. These 'wannarexics' are exactly that, girls who 'wanna' fit in."
